- Ten-month program (41 weeks)

VA San Diego Dietetic Internship General Information, continued

- Program concentration:
 - Medical Nutrition Therapy in Inpatient & Outpatient Settings
- U.S. Citizen
- Six interns annually (April match)
- VA onboarding
 - Must pass background check
 - Health screening and immunizations
- Summer "homework"
- Flu shots required in fall (provided free at VA)
- COVID-19 vaccine required
 - full immunity required by start date in August 2023

Dietetic Internship Application Process

- Complete DICAS application online at:
 - DICAS Application Portal
 - Portal opened in October & closes Feb. 15, 2022 @ 11:59pm (Central Time) for Spring 2023 match;
 DICAS Fee= \$50 first application; \$25 each additional
- Personal statement (≤ 1000 words in response to six questions)
- Three letters of recommendation
 - Recommend at least one from DPD faculty
- DPD Course List Form
- DPD Declaration of Intent to Complete -or-Verification Statement – DPD Program Director
- Official transcripts ALL colleges sent to DICAS



Dietetic Internship Match Process

- D&D Digital (<u>www.dnddigital.com</u>)
 - Register online and pay \$65 D&D fee
 - Submit and prioritize selected Dietetic Internships online before
 March 27, 2023 @ II:59pm (Central Time).
- Match Day, Sunday, April 2
- Appointment, Monday, April 3rd by 6pm local time



VA San Diego Dietetic Internship Selection Criteria

- Holistic application review process
- U.S. Citizen
- Letters of recommendation
- Work experience
 - Experience in dietetic field is helpful
- Leadership experience/potential
- Clarity of personal statement
- Minimum GPA = 3.0
 - Cumulative & DPD GPAs (Science, Professional & Total)
- Recency of education requirement
 - DPD Verification Statement within past 3 years
 - MNT course(s) within last 3 years
- FlipGrid interviews (asynchronous)



Master's Degree Requirement

- Commission on Dietetic Registration (CDR) administers the RD Exam
- Effective January 1, 2024, CDR will require a Master's Degree to take the RD exam
 - Master's Degree
 - 2. DPD requirements
 - 3. Supervised practice (internship)
- Effective with this Spring 2023 application cycle, Master's degree is required for admission to the VA San Diego Dietetic Internship



COVID-19 Requirements

- COVID-19 vaccination is required
- COVID screening questions when entering medical center and VA clinics
- Masks required:
 - In the hospital, including intern office, RD/DTR offices
 & NFS kitchen
 - VA offsite clinics
- VA provides medical masks and face shields/safety goggles





- Internship Classes
 - In-person with some virtual presentations
 - Masks and social distancing in the classroom
 - Limited eating & drinking in the classroom

COVID-19 Requirements

- VA rotations
 - Inpatient interactions
 - Most patient visits are in person
 - Some visits via telephone, if needed
 - Outpatient appointments
 - Some are virtual (phone or video) & some are in-person
 - Specialty outpatient appointments are in person (i.e., diabetes, hemodialysis)
 - Most patient nutrition classes are currently virtual (video)





- Affiliate (community) rotations
 - School Nutrition Onsite
 - Public Health Virtual with some onsite events
 - WIC Transitioning back to onsite



VA San Diego Dietetic Internship Program Strengths

- Preceptors and Staff
 - Organized, pre-determined rotation schedule
 - Supportive director, preceptors & staff
 - Qualified, knowledgeable and experienced preceptors with varied backgrounds, educational experiences and advanced credentials

 - One-on-one rotations with clinical preceptors
 - Hands-on with opportunity to learn from experienced preceptors and staff
 - Challenging clinical rotations
